Holy Week is here. We join in the story of Jesus as he journeys towards the cross, with Maundy Thursday, Good Friday.

Our Maundy Thursday service is available online at <u>eastportumc.org/worship</u>.

There will be two options to join in worship online on Good Friday. One is a Tenebrae Service in collaboration with Pastor Meredith and Trinity UMC. The other service visits the Stations of the Cross and is done in collaboration with many other Annapolis churches. Both will be available online at eastportume.org/worship.

I am so excited to gather with you this Easter Sunday, both at Thomas Point at 6 a.m. and in the church yard at 10 a.m. Together, while masked and socially distanced, we'll celebrate the everlasting love of God that conquered the grave by celebrating Holy Communion together. We have individually packaged communion juice and wafers available for you to use, and you are also welcome to bring your own bread and juice for this occasion. An online service will also be available featuring our hand bell choir and a special video during children's time.

We'll gather in the yard near the playground, so little ones can play nearby if they need to. Be sure to bring flowers to place on the cross at the 10 a.m. service.

Spring Cleaning

We can tell by the sudden increase in donations that spring cleaning is well underway in our congregation. Three cheers! I thought it might be helpful to provide some guidelines as you sort and determine the best recipient for your cherished items.

- We have stopped collecting Winter outerwear due to storage challenges but will restart our collecting this November for the Winter distribution in partnership with #JustOneSweater.
- We welcome food donations to our pantry but all canned and boxed goods must be sealed, and within the expiration dates. Our volunteers have recently found several donations far exceed expiration dates which preclude their being distributed.
- For our home gardeners, we would really welcome fresh produce and herbs from your garden. These are the most in-demand items at our monthly food pantry.
- We recently helped two families get rehoused with furniture and housewares after a devastating fire in Robinwood. We have concluded our collection of large items. If you still have furniture, housewares and electronics to donate, please contact Sam Coates directly to determine if he has additional families in need of such items.
- Lastly, but most importantly, we must keep our Dignity Pledge in mind with all donations. There is a sentiment in our country that if people have nothing, they should be happy to get anything. We do not see it that way. We believe that if people have nothing, they have already gotten the worst in life. Now, it is time to give them the best. Unless you would wrap it up with a bow and gift it to your loved ones, we will not gift the donation to our families.

The Reentry Task Force that meets to support Pastor Chris in making pandemic-related decisions has decided to set May 23rd (Sunday) as the date for reopening the EUMC facility. That Sunday morning will be our first in-person, indoor service. We will protocols worship have established to minimize the opportunity for community spread of the virus, which will certainly include wearing a mask for entirety of your time inside the building, and maintain physical distance (i.e. every other pew) while seated in the sanctuary. We're not quite ready to welcome everyone to the Fellowship Hall afterward, but we'll look forward to being able to do that in the future!

The 23rd also marks the date when we will welcome the other users of the facility, such as the Seventh Day Adventist Church, the Colonial Nursery School and the recovery groups, back to the building. We will provide them with expectations for mask-wearing, social distancing and cleaning/disinfecting after their meetings, and we're confident they'll be as eager to return to EUMC as we are!

Even though we will return to in-person worship beginning May 23rd, the Worship Team has committed to continuing to provide an online worship experience for the foreseeable future. We've heard great feedback for how that new medium has been a blessing to members and non-members alike, so we hope to continue serving them in that way.
